

# Caring For Your Cabinets



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**Caring properly for your cabinets will keep them looking beautiful throughout the years. We suggest the following:**

- After installation is complete, wipe the cabinets with a soft, clean cloth dampened slightly with water. Dry immediately with another clean, soft cloth.
- AVOID using a dishcloth to clean or dry cabinets as it may contain remnants of detergent or grease.
- Regular cleaning requires only wiping with a dampened cloth and then drying. Remove oil, grease, or general soil by using a clean cloth dampened with a fresh solution of mild dishwashing soap and warm water. Rinse with a clean cloth dampened with clean water and then dry thoroughly.
- WARNING: Excess moisture is one of the worst enemies of any finish. Sink, range, dishwasher, oven, and baseboard areas are most susceptible. Promptly remove any water spills and excess moisture from cabinets using a clean, soft cloth.
- AVOID wood polish, Murphy's Oil Soap or wax. For generations our parents and grandparents have always used these products to clean their cabinets, but today we know that these products cause a build up that will change the surface appearance over time. Additional WARNING: This type of product use can also void your warranty.
- AVOID using harsh detergents, abrasive cleaners, or strong soaps when cleaning. Also, AVOID using ammonia solutions on *or near* cabinets. These substances could have a deteriorating effect on the finished surface.
- Cover nicks and scratches with a tinted putty stick such as the one included in the touch-up kits that are available through Kitchen Views.
- We do not recommend waxing. Over time, waxing and polishing compounds may build up on the surface causing a hazy, streaky appearance. As stated above, this type of product use can also void your warranty.
